I. General admission requirements

This Master's programme is a consecutive course of study pursuant to (section) § 23 Absatz 3 Satz 1 Nummer 1 Buchstabe a BerlHG.

For the general admission requirements for a postgraduate course of study in accordance with § 16 Absatz 1 bzw. Absatz 2 ZSP-HU the requirements for the evidence to be submitted, its source and any forms to be used are set out in the General Appendices 1.1.1. or 1.1.2.

II. Extended conditions of access

The following additional eligibility and qualification requirements must be fulfilled collectively by the applicant. Further details on the requirements for the evidence to be submitted, their source and any forms to be used can be found in the respective General Appendices. If individual evidence is contained in a linked document or if one piece of evidence is to apply to several admission requirements, the relevant document or evidence need only be submitted once.

III. Rules of the selection procedure

a. Quota in the university selection procedure

The quota of study places to be allocated according to the result of the selection procedure to be conducted by the institution of higher education shall amount to 80 per cent.

b. Selection criteria in the university's application procedure

More detailed information on the requirements for the verifications to be submitted, their sources and any forms to be used can be found in the respective listed General Appendices. If individual evidence is contained in a linked document or if one item of evidence is to apply to several selection criteria, the corresponding document or evidence must only be submitted once.

Selection criterion 1	
Designation:	Level of qualification from the previous degree programme (final grade).
Evaluation:	70 from one hundred.
Verification:	The General Appendices. 1.2.3. apply

Selection criterion 2	
Designation:	Quantitative specialisation in previous studies
Evaluation:	30 from one hundred.
Explanation:	Proof of further knowledge, beyond that already required with the extended admission requirement of knowledge, in the foundations of mathematics, probability theory and statistics or further quantitative subjects in the form of an additional quantitative specialisation in previous studies in the subjects of mathematics, probability theory, statistics, econometrics or in comparable courses totalling at least 5 ECTS credits, may lead to a change of rank. ECTS credits that have already been claimed within the scope of the admission requirements "Fundamentals in mathematics, probability theory and statistics or other quantitative subjects" cannot be taken into account again here.

c. Determining the ranking position in the university's selection procedure

The verified, additional scope of academic achievements and examinations in the field of quantitative specialisation in previous studies in the subjects of mathematics, probability theory, statistics and econometrics, or in comparable courses, will be converted into a grading system in accordance with the key below. The grade determined in this way will be used to determine the ranking position in the selection procedure of the institution of higher education with the specified weight in the calculation of the weighted mixed grade, in accordance with the general provisions as per § 35 Absatz 2 ZSP-HU.

The grading system is as follows:

- 20 or more ECTS credits will received a grade of 1,0 (Excellent);
- 10 to less than 20 ECTS credits will receive a grade of 2,0 (Very Good);
- 5 to less than 10 ECTS credits will receive a grade of 3,0 (Good);
- Less than 5 ECTS credits will receive a grade of 4,0 (Adequate).
